Dear Ms Eyckmans,

Thank you for your letter of 19th September 2025, which allows us to have a continuous engagement with all relevant stakeholders in relation to our projects.

Enel's position on the matter was already comprehensively reflected in our previous correspondence to you, including the fact that Enel has done an analysis of the social, economic and environmental context, an environmental and social impact assessment and a human rights due diligence in line with international best practices.

However, we still see benefit in recalling some principles which are consistently applied by the Enel Group:

- In line of our policies, we do not take any position in relation to questions related to any local and/or international political situation. Consistently, we confirm Enel's willingness to engage with any interested stakeholders as long as this relates to our project and its benefits and not to any political issue.
- All projects mentioned in your letter were developed and are operated without any exploitation or depletion of any non-renewable resources and a sustainability plan has been developed according to international best practices with the aim to create benefits and advantages, social-economic development, employment for the territory, especially for the Saharawi people, as well as its environment also during the project lifecycle.
- The decisions of the Court of Justice of the European Union relate to the Law of Treaties are therefore only applicable to States. Enel is committed to comply with all applicable laws but has not identified any international legal rule that would impede renewable investments in Western Sahara by a private

investor. Moreover, when developing projects Enel consistently applies its internal policies which embrace the United Nations Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights and other soft law acts (for example, the OECD guidelines relating to human rights) and international best practices; all relevant ESG related events are reported in Enel Integrated Annual Report.

Based on the above, we assure you that we continue to engage with all the relevant stakeholders until the end of the Project's useful life in order to identify any measure to create benefits and advantages, social-economic development, and employment for the territory, also for the Saharawi people, in line with international best practices.

We do not provide confidential information on projects. However, should there be any further material developments or initiatives in the area, Enel will communicate through the usual channels according to its internal policies and applicable law.

We thank you for your attention and remain available for further dialogue.
